Class 1				
<p>Upgrade the toilets. Hand driers don't really work - they don't dry hands. The taps stop too quickly and you have to keep pushing them. Some of the locks on the cubicles don't work.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Downstairs, the cubicle closest to the sink is ok. On the other two the locks are broken. Upstairs someone took a lock off - Mr Galliers knows about it. In the girls' toilet downstairs, there's a leak in the first cubicle. Upstairs, boys, the hand dryer works nicely but one tap you have to press lots and one gets stuck. When you press the taps the water sprays over you. <p>Action All school councillors take note: if you are aware of something that is broken or not working properly, tell your teacher. They will write it in Mr Galliers' jobs book and he will try to fix it. AB to ask Mr Galliers to check all the cubicle locks, and adjust any taps that turn off too quickly. <p>Lots of children have run out of coloured pencils. There is a problem with children losing things from their stationery bag..</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> People are losing their glue sticks. Some people's bags, the zips are breaking so things fall out. 				

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Classes are running out of whiteboard pens. • Losing pencil sharpeners because the bag breaks. • Class 12 running out of sharpening pots. • When people pull their things out of the bag they have a stationery explosion. • Someone puts their stationery on the table, then someone mistakes it for their own. • The tray falls off the desk and things fall out. • Could we bring our own pencil case. • We are trying not to do that because we are trying not to bring so much stuff in. • Put your name on things. <p>Action School Councillors ask teachers about using sticky labels to put names on items. School Councillors to remind all children that it is their responsibility to look after their things and keep their tray and bag tidy. AB to talk to the office staff about the quality of the zip bags – see if there is an alternative.</p>	<p>All All AB</p>

<p>The soap hurts hands if you've got the tiniest cut.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Washing hands with soap is better than using sanitiser. • If you bring your own sanitiser, it should be scent free. • Hand sanitiser is worse for stinging. • The soap in the Mr Soapy dispensers is not so painful. • Some people have really dry hands. You could ask teachers not to squirt stingy soap, use soap by the sink. <p>Action: Ask staff to prioritise the Mr Soapy, rather than the Carex soap, if time allows, and respect children's choice if they are suffering from the Carex soap. AB to ask Mr Galliers to make sure Mr Soapy dispensers are attached to the wall in classes so they can be used.</p>	<p>AB AB</p>

<p>When are we going to have the school shop?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We can't do it because of year group bubbles. • Could we do it in the playground? • Could we do it after school? • Could we take a few products round to classes? • Or set up in Hall and Dining Hall and call a class at a time? • Restrict numbers, and not so often. • Could children write orders on a slip and leave the money in an envelope? <p>Action Year 6 councillors to find out from teachers if anyone is interested, in running School Shop, and ask them to arrange a meeting with Mrs Hughes to discuss how it would work safely</p>	<p>Year 6</p>

<p>Is it possible to have seconds in lunch?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Some children get small portions and are still hungry afterwards. • If you give too much, there might be food waste. • When we served whole baguettes, children were throwing a lot away. • The baguettes aren't really half, usually smaller. 	

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It was nice having a whole baguette because it fills you up. You should be able to choose. • You could bring your own packed lunch if you feel you need more. • You could also bring snacks for playtime. • It would be better if you could choose your packed lunch options from a self-service counter, but that's not possible at the moment because of the covid precautions. • Now we are going in for lunches year by year, it might be easier to arrange seconds. <p>Action: AB Ask Sharon whether it is possible for children to choose a half or whole baguette size. He could ask them. <p>Action: Y6 to ask the Team captains to work with Shine to sort out some internal sport competitions. <p>After school could we come in in dressing gowns and bring some money and have a story and milk and biscuits?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maybe once a term. • It would have to be done in year group bubbles. • It could raise money either for the school or for a charity. • Lots of charities like NSPCC are finding it hard to raise money at the moment, so this would be good. <p>Action: AB to ask HENSA if they would like to organise a Bedtime Story Evening as a fundraiser.
